Statement from the scientific director of the debats

New technological possibilities are accompanied with uses that profoundly transform our ways of representing the world and our socio-economic environments. Metaverse, blockchain, and non-fungible tokens (NFTs) all appear as different fields of experimentation and expression to bring out the symbolism of these new fields, modes of communication and interaction. Digital artists use these technologies in their artistic production, both to question their function and to sublimate their work, amplifying their relationship with the viewer or collector.

From compositions to patterns, from geometry to algebra, mathematics and visual art are intrinsically linked. Cryptography, by becoming an essential element of the support of digital works, with files (jpg, png...) and non-fungible tokens (NFTs), also acting as a source of inspiration for the artist. Artists play with the codes and tools of blockchain technology and culture to renew artistic trends by offering new experiences to the spectator, the patron and the collector. Bitcoin puzzles, which are true mathematical enigmas, are a perfect example of this approach, as they propose that the symbolism of the work can only be experienced once it has been deciphered.

Digital technology is no longer limited to reproducing the world, it has become a completely new matrix of ideas and experiences.

Digital culture invades and revolutionises traditional societal and cultural representations.

Faced with this overarching digital culture, cultural particularisms either resist, disappear, or mutate. It is these mutations and their artistic and symbolic manifestations that Metaculture proposes to study and present through the prism of the Arab world. For two days, the Malek Chebel Foundation's Metaculture project will organise an event at the Institut du monde arabe, bringing together exhibitions by over fifty artists at multidisciplinary and multi-actor conferences. These will be organised under the scientific direction of the UNESCO chair, "Innovation Transmission et Edition Numériques" (ITEN), of the Fondation Maison des Sciences de l'Homme (FMSH) and the Université Paris 8.

Through the prism of art, this event proposes to highlight the technological, societal, economic, and geopolitical issues of our time, the evolutions of our representation of the world and new utopias.

GRASP THE ART OF CRYPTOGRAPHY

The virtual space of digital media is gradually reaching into all areas of our lives, including the sensory realm of art. The dematerialisation of art should not imply renouncing place, space, material and structure. In fact, by digital art, we mean art that also occupies electronic space. Furthermore, it involves creation and dissemination, which allow the visual and audio arts to take on new forms. This will enable artists to create and protect their art, in other words, an technological re-evolution. Using blockchain technology, artists can turn their art into a file, which can be monitored at each step of the production-circulation process. This ensures copying and distribution can be controlled. When discussing crypto-art, we frequently hear of disintermediated control of artist's from their work.

Crypto-art, like all art, must have physical and human means to be seen, experienced and shared. Therefore, the need for museums, events, places and symposiums to showcase work and encourage dialogue is apparent. Furthermore, the project aims to ensure that academic and scientific circles understand the emergence of the 'Cryptos' as a watershed in the History of Art.

Despite the rise of new, impressively vibrant artistic trends, digital artwork is struggling to gain a foothold in major museums and institutions. Traditionally, French public authorities have supported and overseen development in the arts and culture. It is, thus, vital to encourage the emergence of future French talent and put Paris at the forefront of this technological revolution by establishing an innovative public-private partnership dedicated to Crypto-art.



Crypto-art is characterized by the multiplicity of trends that compose it: collectibles, pixel art, generative art... One of them, the collections of profile avatars that share common traits, but unique characteristics, marks a turning point in the involvement of NFT holders. NFTs enable the creation of communities. Artists or creators can then unite their collectors around a common project. Moreover, it is possible to integrate NFT holders into a decentralized autonomous organization managed by its members and to submit to a vote certain decisions concerning the life of the work or the use of funds. More generally, with the rise of NFTs, it is power relationships and the empowerment of artists that are being questioned. With the new characteristics of reduced governance, artists question the new limits of digital art and NFTs and reinvent the practices of the contemporary art.

DON'T USE, CREATE! THE POSSIBILITIES THAT NFTS OFFER TO ARTISTS.

The most revolutionary attribute of NFT technology is the link that is created between the artist and their creation. The artist can track which portfolio their works are in and therefore which collectors own their productions. These collectors form a community that surrounds and accompanies the artist. The latter can cherish their community by offering them new works. It is this disintermediated link between the artist and his public, which makes them take the role of either a producer or a patron. Moreover, the artist can program the NFT to receive a commission on each resale, thus gaining access to the financial bonus generated by the second market. What will become of galleries and museums? Does this paradigm shift impact the creative process?

Although virtual, crypto-currencies create effective environmental hazards. The computers used to mine cryptocurrency consume large amounts of electricity all the time. We are talking about a carbon footprint capable of endangering the environment. Until now, few studies have been done on this issue, which is why we want to discuss the subject without any ambiguity. Are NFTs anti-environmental? What measures should be taken to reduce possible environmental risks?

You've surly noticed the monkeys or the pixel punks? Picture For Proof (PFP), a concept that irrigates the collective imagination of the networkosphere. The idea that NFTs represent digital avatars was inspired by the CryptoPunks project in 2017. The connection between NFTs and social network PFPs was reinforced when Twitter proposed using them to certify users' accounts (a special hexagonal border attests of their authenticity). Several other social networking giants are working on integrating the PFP project into their feature repertoires. This technology has recently become a lucrative market where large amounts of cryptocurrencies are being invested. What is behind these PFPs? Will they be a regulator of the crypto market?

DRIVING A GROUP WITHOUT A LEADER, HOW DO DAOS "DECENTRALIZED AUTONOMOUS ORGANIZATIONS" RETHINK POWER RELATIONSHIPS WITHIN A COLLECTIVE?

DAO, Acronym for Decentralized Autonomous Organization. The DAO is an organization that

operates through a set of smart contracts that are computer protocols providing transparent

and immutable governance rules to the community. It is a system that demonstrates the



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culmination of technological progress in its ability to assist in decision making. A DAO can allow its contributors to be remunerated, either in crypto currency (ETH, BTC, DAI) or in shares of the DAO in proportion to the value of each member's contribution. Deployed through blockchain, the DAO proposed to transform hierarchical power relationships into horizontal, collaborative and participatory human organizations.

THE WEB 3 ON THE TEST OF PHILOSOPHY. FROM A SYMBOLIC REVOLUTION TO A POTENTIAL REVOLUTION?

In 1998, in a lecture at the Collège de France, Pierre Bourdieu considered Édouard Manet's "Déjeuner sur l'herbe" (1832-1883) as an attack, a symbolic revolution, which provides an alternative perspective on the structures and power relations of a society. Bourdieu saw Monet's painting as a revolutionary act, one that challenged the dynamics of domination between different classes in society. In turn, Michel Onfray's views on blockchain, cyberpunks, or NFTs add new elements to this reflection, providing a modern example of how power shifts and changes over time. Although Bourdieu and Onfray's views differ greatly in approach and scope, they both share the underlying belief that power is a fluid concept and must be actively addressed if we are to be able to understand it.

WHAT IS BITCOIN AND WHAT IS ITS USE FOR THE GENERAL PUBLIC?

Cryptocurrencies are decentralized digital currencies based on blockchain technology. Unlike the U.S. dollar or the euro, there is no central authority that controls and maintains their value. Over the past three years, the totally unexpected scale of this revolution has continued to generate much debate. While there are over 19,000 different cryptocurrencies in circulation, the most popular remains Bitcoin. What makes Bitcoin different from other cryptocurrencies? What explains its success around the world? Does transactional transparency provide reassurance to various stakeholders, especially in the charitable and refugee aid community? What are the initiatives to reduce the social cost of carbon?

MONETARY SOVEREIGNTY: HOW BITCOIN IS RESHUFFLING THE GEOPOLITICAL DECK?

In 2008, Bitcoin was born. Satochi Nakamoto created a computer protocol intended to allow the exchange of value without a trusted third party, secure and without any controlling authority. Driven by a libertarian philosophy, the creator(s) wanted to offer an alternative solution to the use of banks and fiat currencies. Nearly 15 years after the publication of the first transaction block, several states recognize Bitcoin as a legal tender. The adoption of Bitcoin as an official currency marks its shift from the category of crypto-assets to the status of "currency. Geopolitics, economics, energy resources, the environment - the issues raised by this development are numerous. Who and where are the miners who create the new Bitcoins being put into circulation? What is the weight of access to energy resources? What are the economic strategies for states that decide to adopt Bitcoin as a legal tender?

Trying to understand crypto-currencies without asking questions of their context would be a challenge. The Bitcoin revolution has led some central banks and financial institutions to study the economic and geopolitical consequences of the widespread use of digital currencies. Between supporters and opponents of Bitcoin's adoption as an official currency, state economic policies evoke the term "sovereignty," often accompanied by "geopolitics." How can Bitcoin redistribute the world's geopolitical maps?

DECENTRALIZATION: THE FUTURE OF THE GLOBAL ECONOMY?

Some aspects of the international monetary system have radically transformed in record time to compensate for economic and financial failures. Transactions have evolved with technological advancement, which has been able to ensure a qualitative leap, especially in cryptocurrencies. Transactions are not stored on a central computer (a server), but recorded and updated on a network of computers in P2P, without the intervention of a central authority. This decentralization, both in the exchange of information and in the storage of information and the network, makes this technology one of the most secure available. The decentralization of the relationship to monetary systems marks an important point in the future of the global economy.

WHAT ARE THE THERAPEUTIC USES OF VIRTUAL REALITY?

Virtual worlds accompany the rise of NFTs by extending the immersion in the digital experience. The synergies between virtual worlds and cryptos are numerous, and their development is taking place in parallel and correlatively. Virtual worlds are the renewed expression of the way to present oneself in a virtual way (avatars, clothing, etc.), to create and to interact. These new worlds arouse fantasies, hopes and mistrust. They crystallize fears of seeing the human being annihilated by the machine, and fuel projections where virtual worlds are intended to replace reality. In addition to the uses of entertainment and social interaction, virtual reality is used as a promising object of study for therapeutic purposes. Creation, emotions, religion, it is appropriate to question the place that central themes of our societies can take in this new space. Whatever the uses or the subjects addressed, ethics plays an important role in order to analyze the contours of virtuous, respectful and inclusive the Metaverse.

Metaverses are immersive digital spaces that already have numerous applications in teaching and learning, from virtual museums that transport children around the world to interactive experiences with 3D models of human anatomy, educators will be able to rely on metaverses in the future as an auxiliary pedagogical tool for transmission. The goal of this conference is not to simply describe what is currently happening in the field of metaverse, but to look to the future by further exploring how metavers can be applied and enhanced in a variety of educational domains, especially as they relate to the teaching practices of our future generations.

Four major guidelines

The exhibition will be dedicated to contemporary art from the Arab region, understood as a geographical space that includes many different cultures and populations. The Arab world includes: Morocco, Algeria, Tunisia, Libya, Egypt, Lebanon, Syria, Iraq, Jordan, Saudi Arabia, Yemen, Oman, United Arab Emirates, Qatar, Bahrain, Kuwait, Sudan, Palestine, Comoros, Somalia, Mauritania, Sudan and Djibouti.

Curation will be provided by a small number of carefully selected curators. These curators have been nominated due to their artistic vision and their in-depth knowledge of the direction of our research and the technological means characteristic of digital art.

Four major themes have guided the selection of works:

Refinement Love Imaginary Light





Refinement

Not well known, the innovations of Arab civilization in the field of art are, nevertheless, one of the most beautiful illustrations of a culture with a strong personality. Indeed, very early on, artistic excellence in Arab lands constituted the ideal of a privileged social group whose originality and talent would have a lasting impact on the court society in Baghdad during its influence, in Cordoba, in the Maghreb or in Egypt.

This brilliant society indulged, with equal satisfaction, in fine literature, morality, sports, games, gastronomy, idleness and joyful friendship, and did not disdain wine or other forbidden pleasures.

However, after having been the mirror of elegance and an emblem of good taste, where an idle, carefree and wealthy society was promoted, this exquisite art will become an empty shell, mannerist and affected. Arab artists have always been faithful to this culture, characterized by a set of attitudes that denote an abundance of subtlety, savoir-vivre and finesse in its followers. This exhibition will be conceived as an exploration of refinement in the Arab world.

Love

«Arabs have ninety-nine names for Allah, the one God, and one hundred to describe love» Malek Chebel

To evoke love, the Arabs use images that suggest burning, thirst for the beloved, raving, and, often, decay. Islam has made love a physical feeling by assigning it to erotic content and a vocation of fertility and pleasure; it has humanized it. Although nowadays it is fairly unknown, except for its feats of arms, due to its expansion and architecture, the Islamic civilization remains one of the most fertile in terms of aesthetics and love.

With respect to love, Cicero obviously includes desire, because man cannot renounce desire, due to the risk of losing the meaning of life. The desire is situated in a complex domain composed of nature and culture, but also of an unfathomable part of freedom. Therefore, love is the fulfillment of oneself through the other. To speak of desire is to speak of the other. To speak about oneself through the other is only the beginning of a socialization, the establishment of a link, the representation of oneself given in sharing.



From love, we are born.

It is to love that we tend.

To love, we devote ourselves.

Imaginary

Beyond their individual character, the great examples of Arab-Muslim imaginations are more than mediations or reminders. They have their own anthropological identity. The paths that lead to the imaginary are multiple, and fit so perfectly into the intertwining passage of life that it is useless to draw up a list of them, even a summary one.

In short, the imaginary is one of the prerequisites for any research on the founding characteristics of the Arab-Muslim civilization, apprehended through the triple subconscious "Arab, Berber and Muslim".

To explore the imaginary is to penetrate deep into the soul of millions of Arabs around the world, their way of life and their founding myths, their languages, their music, their taste for storytelling and orality, their folklore, their mysticism and, of course, their belief in a secure afterlife compared to a daily life described as "difficult and deceptive".

Light

Light upon light, Nur 'ala Nur, is a Qur'anic expression that the Prophet is said to have explained from the emanation of bestowal, faydh, explaining that "God created the world in darkness, then poured out his light upon it".

Across its various meanings, light is a key concept in Islamic philosophy.

However, it is necessarily more positive than darkness, as light is embedded in a network of meanings that are more metaphorical than real. It is precisely the passage from the metaphorical to the real, from light to action, from the static to the moving, that symbolizes the problematic nature of the evolution of contemporary artistic practice in the Arab world and that interests us here today.

Neïl Beloufa lives and works in Paris. The Franco-Algerian artist has devoted the last decade to reflecting on the issues at stake when apprehending reality and its representation. His artistic range is expansive, varying from film to sculpture to installation, and his work draws on his interest in what actually exists and how it is perceived. A tends to depict subjects without moral preconceptions, cultural arrogance, or sarcasm, but rather with humour. Beloufa has been able to capture this concept in a way that has made his work the subject of several exhibitions as well as being included in many notable collections.

"Host B" is an NFT with a counterpart of the same name mapped physically in Neïl Beloufa's solo exhibition "Digital Mourning" at the Pirelli Hangar Biccoca, in Milan.In the exhibition, Host B argues with two other hosts (Host A and C) about what the visitors should watch, think and consume, as if it were the materialization of a politicized algorithm in a social network feed. Host B uses any argument it can to control the exhibition connected to its program. I was interested in the work as an NFT because it affirms its digital existence and, as stated in the exhibition, means the activity, life and value of the artwork are also on the internet.


DEEPINO 4D Max, 2020



This work is a nebulous reference to the famous Saliera by the sixteenth-century Italian goldsmith and sculptor Benvenueto Cellini, completed in 1543 for King Francis I of France. It is an oval vessel composed of two figures: Tellus, the Roman goddess of the earth, and Neptune, the God of the sea. It is made of gold, enamel, ebony and ivory. King Francis I of France provided the artist with a workshop of Parisian craftsmen. The salt shaker was appreciated not only as luxury tableware, dispensing then expensive condiments, but also as an object of intellectual conversation, full of meanings waiting to be decoded by an elite audience of art connoisseurs.

"Deepino 4D Max" embodies a baroque artefact, which turns into a Nespresso coffee machine. Having a flashy and shimmering anthropomorphic character, adorned with a string of cigarettes and fake nails, it can quickly change itself into a coffee machine. The machine becomes a myth, a gargoyle that makes people richer, happier, more aware and more efficient. It is then be transformed into a legendary alchemical substance with magical properties that symbolizes perfection in all its splendor, enlightenment and heavenly bliss. The coffee machine is thus seen as the philosopher's stone, more commonly known as the elixir of immortality in the 21st century.

Like an advertisement that fetishizes its consumers, the design of this coffee machine is to the point of making its function obsolete.

The work takes a different look at the workings of neoliberal capitalism, where the pursuit of surplus value has strongly influenced the ways in which coffee is produced and consumed. The coffee, represented as the subject of the work by a Nespresso machine, relates the spirit of capitalism in a "brewed" form. Its past is linked to the birth of bourgeois entrepreneurship and its future is as dark as the horizon of contemporary society.

Jason Seife



Jason Seife's work relates to ancient Persian rugs, an art form that, in this day and age, is often considered obsolete. Carpets were an important part of his childhood, with immigrant parents of Middle Eastern (Syrian) descent. Jason breathes new life into these ancient weavings by painting them tediously on canvas in colors and mediums not normally used in their origin. The artist brings a new twist to traditional Persian heritage and presents his compositions in an innovative and mesmerizing way. Jason reflects his obsession with detail through the geometric and intricate compositions of the rugs, making the achievement of these artworks both a therapeutic and spiritual process.




This phygital process not only allows Seife to recreate a more impactful visual experience, but it also underscores the idea that craft remains central to the artistic process.

Seife proposes a new meaning for materials and the application originally assigned to them. His process partially emancipates the material from its former definition and original context, and changes its purpose by transforming it into an artistic surface. The work of art is, at the same time, a fragmentary monument, preserved from retouching and remembered as a fragment of a lost history. The alchemical and transformational journey of creation, hardening and creative manipulation of malleable, wet, mortar is part of Seife's artistic practice. In his own words, Seife states that "mortar allows me to create my own eroded artifact of history."

Nouri Flayhan is an illustrator whose influences cannot be limited to the origins of a single country: she was born in the United States of Lebanese parents, then raised in both Kuwait and Lebanon. A graduate of the University of the Arts in London, Nouri has worked with an incredible number of renowned international brands such as Nike, Adidas and Gucci. With vibrant colors and evocative artwork, Flayhan has won over the hearts of many, particularly in the Arab world, of which the artist describes the stories and the chimeras with biro.

Mahsa Amini was a 22-year-old Kurdish woman from western Kurdistan. Her real name was Jina, but she called herself Mahsa because Kurdish names are forbidden.

Jina was accused of improperly wearing her hijab outside a metro station in Iran. She died after spending three days in a coma due to brain damage.

Since her death, women have taken to the streets in protest, many cutting their hair or removing their hijab. They have been shot at and tear-gassed, and internet restrictions have also been put in place.

The whole world came together to rise up and demand freedom of choice and freedom to be.

Jina Amini is Kurdish and means "Women, Life, Freedom".






Ahaad Alamoud

Muhcine Ennou is a Moroccan artist living in Amsterdam. Through his work on such specific cultural context, the artist captures an embodied sociological narrative or describes a reaction to a somatic experience of a lived moment. Guided by intuition and emotion, Muhcine is a self-taught artist who has trained in photography, computer graphics, and film. 





Lydia Ourahmane



Lydia Ourahmane's works often begin with large open-ended propositions. Lydia also addresses, through her artistic touch, the political, environmental, and metaphysical conditions in which she operates. Her works are mainly related to a distant desert, where she describes how and why one travels there and what the conditions are of the image that is produced. More precisely, it is about the Tassili n'Ajjer, an almost inaccessible plateau located on the border between Libya and the southeast of Algeria (her native country). Her films, like her sculptures, associate an excessive visuality with speculation on what cannot be seen, but rather dwelling on what is is felt or imagined. This feeling is frequently reinforced by a reflective sheen that makes the dark surface of her pieces ambiguous.



Her works are distinguished not only by their conceptual identity, but also their timelessness. As a self-taught artist, Lara relies primarily on experimentation and construction to create particular worlds and moments, which she prefers to imagine and fabricate rather than simply document. She has participated in a number of local and international exhibitions, both as a group and on her own.

Inspired by Terry Gilliam's stop-frame "Animation of a man eating a fish", made of hand drawn images created in 1970, this is one of the first animations and moving images made. It shows a lady regurgitating a fish. This works celebrate Terry Gilliam's work and the Dada movement in general. "L'impertinente", with her arrogant look and fishy manner, could also be perceived as a reference to the French tradition of the Poisson D'avril.






















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
